At Our Last Meeting

A Vortex Bowl - Tony Jones

(March 2023)

The club welcomed Tony in March where he demonstrated the turning of his signature Vortex Bowl

After a quick introduction about his past career and the reasons behind his love of turning the demonstration quickly started.

A brief overview of the chuck and mounting methods for the initial turning and then onto facing the blank



with a bowl gouge before doing the same with the side of the blank.

Tony was using sycamore for the demonstration owing to its ease of turning and the shavings soon started to fly.

A recess was cut into the base for an expanding chuck and the outside quickly shaped to a super smooth finish and an elegant flowing profile. Some

quick sanding followed as the club dust extractor inconveniently refused to work. An excellent finish was achieved and polished using cellulose sanding sealer thinned down by 50% with cellulose thinners. A final polish was then given using wax polish.

Once the piece was reversed it was partially hollowed, the final wall thickness for the first third of the bowl was turned to completion whilst there was some meat retained in the bottom of the bowl. The rest of the hollowing was completed with a bowl gouge and finally finished with a large scraper before sanding and the same polishing method as the outside was used.



The final stage was the remounting of the bowl in Cole Jaws to turn away the recess as all turners like to have a "smooth bottom"
