The demonstration started with a piece of cherry mounted between centres and shaped before a spigot was turned to fit the chuck to enable the hollowing to be carried out.

Once the blank was remounted on the chuck various ways of boring the vase were discussed, but Wolfgang showed us how he uses a spindle gouge presented dead on centre to drill a hole, then still using the same tool, the bulk of the vase was hollowed. The importance of clean cuts was emphasised before sanding the inside.

The inside completed, Wolfgang then returned to the outside to complete the shaping before sanding again. The shape although appearing simple was a pleasing design which has taken a lot of time to develop.


The top of the vase was then shaped with a saw before the piece was removed from the lathe before more shaping with rotary cutters and small carving tools. Once the carving was complete the inside and rim were protected with masking tape before a spray coat of colour was applied.





Care with the application of the paint and the removal of the tape was really emphasised.

It was a really good evening with all of the members thoroughly enjoying the demonstration and the banter!



We will look forward to seeing Wolfgang again soon!
